Human rights education connects youth

Training course ``*Human Rights Education today, for an equal tomorrow*`` placed in Trikala from 8th to 17th of February 2020 brought together thirty young people from ten European countries.

Topics as migration and position of minorities were discussed during the many morning and afternoon sessions. The project achieved significant growth of tolerance and compassion for people whose human rights are violated. By putting themselves in other people`s shoes, members of the training came to common conclusions on how to help in solving global issues concerning those whose voices are often not heard. According to the project, the participants had the opportunity to acquire knowledge and implement it in their own workshops. The project was supervised by experienced youth workers and trainers.

Besides non-formal education, the idea was also to allow youth from different parts of Europe to present their origin culture. An example of that activity are intercultural evenings where various traditions were introduced, such as food, drinks and dances. It`s important to address that locals were invited as well.

In addition to mentioned cultures, participants have embraced Greek culture by taking a trip to popular UNESCO protected landmark, Meteora.

The goal was accomplished. The youth developed new skills in working as a facilitator which later they will hopefully apply in raising awareness on discussed problems and solutions. That`s the way they can fulfill the mission of becoming
